





# PRESIDENT MESSAGE (2024–2025)



#### Mining Engineers' Association of India

#### Dear Esteemed Members of MEAI,

It has been an immense honour and privilege to serve as the President of the Mining Engineers' Association of India (MEAI) for the term 2023–2025. As I pen this message coinciding with the installation of the new President, I reflect on a journey marked by transformative initiatives, unwavering commitment from our members, and significant progress toward a more sustainable and resilient mining ecosystem in India.

Over the past two years, MEAI has not only reinforced its stature as the premier professional body for mining engineers but has also expanded its influence across industry, academia, policy, and society. We have strengthened our foundation, redefined our strategic priorities, and delivered value to our members through knowledge exchange, policy advocacy, capacity building, and institutional partnerships.



As I near the completion of my term, I must candidly share that while the journey has been enriching and enjoyable, it has also been a learning experience. I had very high expectations about working for the Association, and while many were met, I was also reminded that "all that glitters is not gold." I assumed office with many aspirations

There were several fulfilling moments, but also a few bitter ones, some of which I shared frankly during the 7th Council Meeting at Udaipur. I trust that members have taken those remarks in the right spirit, as honest reflections intended to improve our collective future.



#### 1. STRATEGIC ENGAGEMENTS AND GOVERNANCE

My tenure witnessed increased engagement with MEAI's governance structures and chapters, promoting unity, transparency, and collaboration. I had the honour of presiding over and participating in multiple National Council Meetings:

- 1st Council Meeting (04.11.2023, Hyderabad)
- 2nd Council Meeting (08.01.2024, Jodhpur)
- 3rd Council Meeting (13.04.2024, Bailadila)
- 4th Council Meeting (19.07.2024, Jabalpur) A landmark meeting where Shri Shirish Shekar handed over a substantial cheque of ₹28 lakhs from the Barajamda Chapter's International Conference. Additionally, ₹5 lakhs was presented by Shri Dhananjaya G Reddy (VP-II) and Shri K. Madhusudhana (IPP) from the National Conclave organized by the Bangalore Chapter.
- 5th Council Meeting (09.11.2024, Hutti Gold Mines, Karnataka)
- 6th Council Meeting (01.02.2025, Belagavi)
- 7th Council Meeting (26.04.2025, Udaipur)
- 8th Council Meeting (18.07.2025, Bhubaneshwar)

Each Council meeting brought with it introspective reviews, strategic dialogue, and key decisions to guide MEAI forward.

In addition, I had the privilege to attend the 51st Annual General Meeting held at Jabalpur, where I witnessed the excellent efforts of the Jabalpur Chapter led by Dr Pukhraj Nenival (Chairman) and Shri Pratyendra Upadhyay (Secretary). Their thoughtful organisation and warmth were truly commendable.

#### 2. STRENGTHENING OUR CHAPTERS - A PILLAR OF GROWTH

#### **Ahmedabad Chapter:**

Celebrating 27 glorious years, emerged as a lighthouse chapter of MEAI. I was honoured to attend its Foundation Day and AGM on 14 June 2024, which included B K Antia Memorial Lecture by Shri Rajnath Ram, Advisor (Energy), NITI Aayog. Indian Mining Day celebrations with a sharp focus on "Women in Mining Industry", including keynote participation from Ms. Bandi Gayatri (Tata Steel), a globally recognised leader in the sector.

**Barajamda Chapter:** Organised the remarkable "EcoVista-2024" conclave and a well-attended seminar on DMS technology, demonstrating leadership in Eastern India.

**Bellary-Hospet Chapter:** From Earth Day, plantation drives, and technical workshops to the grand National Mining Conclave 2024 at IISc, Bangalore, their dynamic approach has set new benchmarks.

**Hyderabad Chapter:** Hosted the impactful National Conference on "Mining the Minerals" and showed leadership in IMIC promotion and student chapter expansion.



**Jaipur Chapter:** Impressed with its structured workshops, SURPAC training, and focus on skill development and sustainability.

**Udaipur Chapter:** Hosted a world-class international conference on Continuous Improvement and Asset Optimisation, and led the student conference on digital mining. Their environmental and training activities reflect true commitment.

**Jodhpur Chapter:** Strong presence in technical training and academic-industry engagement, notably in collaboration with MBM University.

**Rayalaseema Chapter:** Celebrated National Engineer's Day with a technical workshop and inaugurated new student chapters with great enthusiasm.

**Dhanbad Chapter:** Conducted research-led IMD celebrations in collaboration with CSIR-CIMFR and organized an inter-college quiz competition with excellent participation.

**Singareni Chapter:** Rejuvenated itself with fresh leadership, planned technical workshops, and ambitious targets for membership and student engagement.

**Tamil Nadu Chapter:** Celebrated IMD with decentralized and community-focused events across multiple zones, covering Chennai, Ariyalur, Salem, and Tirunelveli.

**Bhubaneswar, Belgaum, and Bengaluru Chapters:** Their inclusive IMD celebrations, especially focused on "Women in Mining", showcased our shared values of equity and empowerment.

Their contributions have been vital in propelling MEAI's growth and visibility across the nation.

#### 3. EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN:

Aligning with the national movement on empowering women, we inducted Ms. Sakshi Gupta (Udaipur Chapter) as a Special Invitee to the Council, marking a significant step towards inclusivity. Further, we resolved to include one woman nominee from each chapter (that fields at least two candidates) in the forthcoming Council Elections (2025–2027).

To amplify this vision, Ahmedabad Chapter organized a virtual panel discussion titled "Celebrating Women in Mining" in March 2025, with participants from Hindalco, Vedanta, WIM India, HZL, and moderated by Ms. Veena Padia, CEO, GVT GMDC.

However, despite these steps, a disconcerting experience during the nomination process for the upcoming elections highlighted the distance still to be covered. A qualified and enthusiastic woman candidate was denied the opportunity to contest for a leadership role, with one of the unstated reasons appearing to be her gender and youth. This experience exposed an underlying bias that still exists, even as we strive for equity.



As I reflected on the incident, one thought resonated deeply:

"A whole generation worked to empower women, but forgot to teach men how to live with empowered women."

Let this serve as a call to action for our Association to not only advocate change, but also embody it—in our actions, policies, and mindset.

#### 4. YOUTH-CENTRIC INITIATIVES - INVESTING IN THE FUTURE

During my tenure, **10 new Student Chapters** were launched across engineering colleges and universities, significantly increasing our student membership base. These initiatives aim to nurture future mining leaders through early engagement and exposure.

A defining moment of my term was the **International Conference on 'Future of Mining: Digital Empowerment and Youth-Driven Sustainability'** hosted by MEAI Rajasthan-Udaipur Student Chapter in collaboration with CTAE, MPUAT. This **'By Students, For Students'** event (22–23 February 2025) was a bold statement of our vision to empower the next generation of mining leaders. I had the privilege to preside over the inaugural and valedictory sessions, engaging directly with over 50 student researchers from IITs, NITs, MBM Jodhpur, and many other prestigious institutions. Their passion and innovation were truly the highlight of the event.

#### 5. EDUCATION, TRAINING & PROFESSIONAL EXCELLENCE

MEAI continued to invest in professional development through its flagship:

- MEAI Professional Development Program (MPDP-V) Conducted from November to December 2024, this highly successful program featured 24 technical sessions by 16 industry experts. It witnessed enthusiastic participation from over 50 mining professionals from leading organizations including NMDC, Tata Steel, JSW, Vedanta, and GMDC.
- Monthly MEAI Tech Series Lectures

These learning platforms ensured that MEAI remained a beacon of continuous learning in the mining domain.

A special mention must be made of the invaluable contribution of Late Shri Deepak Vidyarthi, who selflessly anchored and organized the MPDP and MTS programs over the years. His sudden demise in February 2025 has created an irreplaceable vacuum in MEAI's training ecosystem. Shri Vidyarthi was a stalwart of our fraternity with over four decades of industry experience and a legacy of technical excellence and mentorship. We are exploring alternate arrangements for these programs, but his dedication and presence will be deeply missed. We pay our heartfelt tribute to him and pray for eternal peace to the departed soul.

#### 6. KNOWLEDGE SHARING & POLICY INTERVENTIONS

I had the honour to participate in critical discussions, notably:

- Panel on Supreme Court Ruling on Mining Royalties (Nov 2024, Hutti Gold Mines)
- Seminar on Diversified Transportation for Mining in Kachchh Region (26 Mar 2025, Kutch)
- Seminar on "Mining Plan & Mine Closure Plan 2025: New Guidelines, Key Changes, and Comparative Analysis" (April 2025, Ankleshwar)

These events strengthened MEAI's advocacy for sustainable, policy-aligned mining practices.



#### 7. MAJOR EVENTS AND CONFERENCES

One of the crowning achievements of this term was presiding over the **International Conference on "Centre of Excellence in Mining (Continuous Improvement and Asset Optimisation)"** held at Udaipur (26–27 April 2025). Organised jointly by MEAI Rajasthan Chapter, Udaipur and Hindustan Zinc Ltd., it brought together stalwarts like Shri Peeyush Narayan Sharma (IBM), Shri Bhagwati Prasad Kalal (IAS), Shri Arun Misra (CEO-HZL), and others.

This conference stood as a testimony to MEAI's role in shaping policy and technology for **critical and strategic minerals**, sustainability, and innovation.

A notable feature was the **active involvement of students and young professionals**, who were given the opportunity to present papers and share field experiences.

#### 8. NATIONAL CONNECT & COMMUNITY BUILDING

During my tenure:

- I visited chapters in Goa, Bengaluru, Bellary-Hospet, and Barajamda
- Engaged in multiple interactive sessions with professionals and students
- Championed the establishment of student chapters in institutions such as **NITK Suratkal** and **Dr. Thimmaiah Institute of Technology**.

The successful conduct of the **MEAI National Quiz 2024** further reinforced our commitment to member engagement. Dhanbad Chapter clinched the title, followed closely by Barajamda and Udaipur – my heartfelt congratulations to all winners!

#### 9. CONCLUDING REFLECTIONS

This two-year journey as President has been both fulfilling and humbling. From the hills of Udaipur to the mines of Kutch, from policy panels in Karnataka to student-led conferences in Rajasthan – I have witnessed first-hand the passion, intellect, and dedication that defines MEAI.

- The need for timely rule amendments and interim arrangements via notifications
- Avoiding Indian Mining Day celebrations overlapping with festivals
- Aligning Council and Chapter Executive Committee tenures

I express heartfelt thanks to:





#### Shri. H.V. PALIWAL

Former, Director (Mining Operations)
Hindustan Zinc Limited

Shri H.V. Paliwal, born on 11th November 1937 in Udaipur, Rajasthan, is a distinguished mining engineer whose exemplary contributions have left an indelible mark on India's mining and mineral industry. His journey began with a strong academic foundation—graduating at the top of his class from the College of Mining and Metallurgy, Banaras Hindu University (BHU), in 1958.



For his outstanding academic performance, he was awarded the prestigious BHU Gold Medal and the Roberton Medal by the Mining, Geological & Metallurgical Institute of India (MGMI).

He started his professional career in coal mining but soon joined the Zawar Group of Mines under Hindustan Zinc Limited (HZL) in 1962. Over the next three decades, Shri Paliwal played a pivotal role in the company's transformation. Rising to the position of Director (Mining Operations) in 1985, he led HZL's expansion from 500 tonnes per day to over 10,000 tonnes per day ore production.

Under his leadership, several milestone projects such as the Debari Zinc Smelter, Rampura-Agucha Mine, and Chanderiya Smelter Complex were conceived and executed—laying the foundation for HZL's rise as a global zinc giant.

Post-retirement in 1995, his passion for mining continued as he took up key advisory roles with Binani Industries, Metmin Finance (London), and Indo-Gold Mines. His efforts included the successful acquisition of Luanshya Copper Mines in Zambia and exploration projects across Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh. He also represented India at major international forums, including the UNEP in Geneva, IAEA in the Philippines, and the World Mining Congress in Beijing.

His global engagements have helped promote Indo-foreign collaborations in mineral exploration and environmental practices.

Shri Paliwal's vast contributions earned him several national honors, including the National Mineral Award (1990-91), the S. J. Coggin Brown Memorial Gold Medal, and the Gold Medal from the Government of Rajasthan for his contributions to mineral development. He also held positions on numerous national committees under the Ministry of Environment & Forests, DGMS, and the Department of Atomic Energy.







# CRIRSCO AGM 2024 & MRMR CONFERENCE

At Hotel Hyatt Regency, Vancouver, Canada on 14-16 October 2024

The CRIRSCO Annual General Meeting (AGM) 2024 took place in Hotel Hyatt Regency, Vancouver, Canada, marking an important event for the global mining industry. This gathering brought together representatives from CRIRSCO's 15 National Reporting Organizations (NROs) to discuss and advance international standards for mineral resource and reserve reporting, representatives from the 15 member countries/regions of CRIRSCO presented during the open sessions. These countries/regions include Australasia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Europe, India, Indonesia, Kazakhstan, Mongolia, Philippines, Russia, South Africa, Turkey, and the USA. NACRI (India) has been represented by two of its representatives on CRIRSCO viz. Mr DB Sundara Ramam, President Elect MEAI & VP (Raw Materials), Tata Steel and Dr PV Rao, Co-Chair NACRI in the AGM.

The topics covered in the NACRI presentation included:

- · Holding NACRI members meetings,
- NACRI meetings with Ministry of Mines (MoM),
- · Registration of RCPs,
- Publication of an article in Indian Express on IMIC implementation in India,
- Nomination of Dr CH Rao as a expert member on Dimensional Stones & Construction Materials (DS&CM) committee of CRIRSCO headed by Dr. Atiye TUĞRUL of Turkiye,
- Organizing a National Seminar by MEAI Hyderabad Chapter on "Advanced Iron Ore Beneficiation & Sustainable Low Grade Iron Ore Utilization" at Hyderabad,
- Holding a meeting of MEAI with MGMI President and Officer bearers in Kolkata,
- Presenting a paper on "Exploration Trends: India vs The World" in a Workshop held on "Technological Advancements in the Indian Mining Industry" at Jabalpur, and
- Conducting IMIC-V training program on May 6-10, 2024 at Hyderabad.





A detailed discussion on "Reciprocity", an Agenda point proposed by India, has been held by the General Body and concluded that the interested NROs may take up this matter mutually with the other NROs to enable the RCPs prepare their Mineral Resources & Mineral Reserves (MRMR) reports, since there could be issues specific to each NRO in recognising other CPs/ QPs. However, NROs such as USA (SME) and Kazakhstan (KAZRC) recognised India's RCPs as CPs and MEAI as a foreign Recognised Professional Organisation (RPO) while Australasia (JORC) and Turkiye (UMREK) forwarded NACRI applications to their respective review committees for delivering a favourable decision.

KCMI (Indonesia) and Canadian Securities Administrators (CSA), Canada declined to recognise India's RCPs due to specific rules approved by their respective Regulators whereas our application for reciprocity is pending with Europe (PERC), Mongolia (MRC), and Philippines (PMRCC) for the final decision.

The CRIRSCO AGM was held from October 14 to 16, 2024, with the following agenda.

The conference program included:

#### Significance of the Event

The 2024 AGM and MRMR Conference in Vancouver represent a significant milestone for CRIRSCO and the mining industry as a whole. CRIRSCO, which now comprises 15 member organizations representing countries and regions worldwide, plays a crucial role in promoting high standards for reporting mineral deposit estimates and exploration results. The event addressed several key topics:

- Harmonization of reporting standards: Discussions on further aligning national and regional reporting codes with the CRIRSCO International Reporting Template
- Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) considerations: Exploring ways to incorporate ESG factors into mineral reporting standards to address growing investor concerns
- Competency requirements: Deliberations on enhancing the definition and enforcement of competency standards for professionals involved in mineral resource estimation and reporting
- Technological advancements: Examining the impact of new technologies on mineral exploration, estimation, and reporting practices.
- International collaboration: Strengthening partnerships between NROs and fostering knowledge exchange to improve global reporting practices
- The strategic partnership with ICMM enables CRIRSCO to more effectively fulfil its mission of promoting high standards in public reporting of mineral deposit estimates and exploration progress, ultimately benefiting its members and the broader mining industry.

The CRIRSCO AGM 2024 and the accompanying MRMR Conference in Vancouver represented a significant opportunity for the global mining community to come together, share insights, and shape the future of mineral resource and reserve reporting. By fostering collaboration and promoting best practices, these events contributed to maintaining investor trust and supporting sustainable development in the mining sector.



# MEAI REPRESENTATIVES MET SHRI. G KISHAN REDDY, HON'BLE MINISTER OF COAL & MINES, GOI

AT HYDERABAD ON 22-12-2024

MEAI representatives-viz. Secretary General Sri M. Narsaiah, former Chairman of the MEAI Hyderabad Chapter Sri B.R.V. Susheel Kumar, and NACRI Co-Chair Dr. P.V. Rao-met with the Honourable Coal and Mines Minister, Government of India, Sri G. Kishan Reddy, in his office in Hyderabad on December 22 at 6 PM. The agenda for the meeting included:

- Including MEAI as a permanent member in all policy formulation committees appointed by the Coal & Mines Ministry, Government of India.
- 2. Adoption of the Indian Mineral Industry Code (IMIC) for reporting exploration results, mineral resources, and reserves as the reporting standard by the Coal & Mines Ministry, Government of India.

Upon learning from us about MEAI's significant strengths and valuable contributions to the mineral sector, the Honourable Minister agreed to include MEAI in the policy formulation committees appointed by the Coal & Mines Ministry.

We then presented to the Honourable Minister the background and importance of adopting the standard CRIRSCO-recognized IMIC much-needed successfully attract foreign investments in exploration and mining within the Indian mineral industry. We also discussed the current status of resource reports made available to bidders by the Government of India during the auction of mineral and coal blocks, as well as the response from the Mines Ministry regarding the adoption of IMIC in India.

The Minister provided ample time for a patient hearing and inquired about the Mines Secretary's response to adopting IMIC in India. We informed him that during our detailed presentation to the Mines Secretary in his office-where CRIRSCO's

# MEAI/ NACRI HELD MEETINGS WITH THE INDIAN GOVT DIGNITARIES

AT NEW DELHI ON 20-21 MARCH 2025

#### 1. Meeting with Hon'ble Mines Minister Shri G. Kishan Reddy

A meeting was held on 21st March with Shri G. Kishan Reddy, Union Cabinet Minister, Ministry of Coal and Mines; Shri Ravi Sharma; and Shri Vineet J. Mehra, along with NACRI members Dr. P.V. Rao, Shri Dhananjay Reddy, and Shri Shameek Chattopadhyay, in his office at Parliament Bhavan. Shri Reddy acknowledged the need to focus on IMIC adoption in India. Due to the ongoing parliamentary session, he was able to spend only a few minutes but assigned two IAS officers to further discuss the matter and gain a better understanding before preparing a note for him. During the discussion, all their queries were addressed, and a copy of the presentation for NITI Aayog was handed over to them.

#### 2. Meeting with Dr. V.K. Saraswat, Hon'ble Member (S&T), NITI Aayog

A meeting was held on 21st March with Dr. V.K. Saraswat, Shri Ishtiyaque Ahmed, Shri Ravi Sharma, and Shri Vineet Mehra, along with NACRI members Dr. P.V. Rao, Shri Dhananjay Reddy, Shri Shameek Chattopadhyay, Shri Shanto Mukherjee, and Shri Afroz from MTCS (Adani Group), at NITI Aayog's office. Dr. Saraswat devoted sufficient time to discussing the adoption of IMIC in India, raising several detailed queries about the subject matter. He clarified that this issue would need to be addressed by the Mines Secretary through amendments to the MEMC Rules and subsequent Cabinet approval. Dr. Saraswat advised MEAI/NACRI to prepare a concise, two-page note summarizing the key points in the MEMC Rules that require modification based on IMIC principles, and to highlight the potential advantages of adopting IMIC. He assured us that, after reviewing this note, he would send recommendations to all relevant stakeholders to ensure its logical conclusion.

#### 3. Discussion with the Mines Secretary, Shri V.L. Kantha Rao during Critical Inter-Ministerial Group meeting

Shri Ravi Sharma and Shri Vineet J. Mehra met with the Mines Secretary on 20th March in his office. The adoption of IMIC in India was discussed during the meeting, and the Mines Secretary assured them that this topic is high on his agenda and that he intends to conclude it at the earliest opportunity.

In addition to the above, the team is also working with very senior officials at the highest possible level. Meetings have been held with them as well; however, their names will not be disclosed until a logical conclusion is reached in the next six months, with regular follow-ups

# 6<sup>TH</sup> IN-PERSON TRAINING PROGRAM ON INDIAN MINERAL INDUSTRY CODE (IMIC)

AT HYDERABAD ON 5TH-9TH MAY 2025

The Mining Engineers' Association of India (MEAI), the trusted voice of the Indian mineral resources sector, is the only Professional Organisation (PO) recognised by CRIRSCO and NACRI in India. As part of its obligations as a PO, NACRI, in collaboration with MEAI, has been periodically steering professional development programs for mineral industry professionals, registering Competent Persons (CPs) under the CRIRSCO-approved Indian Mineral Industry Code for reporting Mineral Resources and Reserves in India (IMIC), and overseeing their code of conduct. Five such training programs on IMIC have been successfully conducted in January 2021, April 2021, April 2022, April 2023, and May 2024. The IMIC training program has received a splendid response from the Indian mineral resources sector, with an average participation of over 35 professionals in each program-the highest being 64 in the 5th program.

Participants have included representatives from several leading Central and State Government-controlled mining companies such as NMDC Limited, Coal India Limited, Hindustan Copper Limited (HCL), MOIL Limited, NLC India Limited, Mineral Exploration and Consultancy Limited (MECL), Hutti Gold Mines Company Limited (HGML), Odisha Mining Corporation Limited (OMCL), Odisha Mineral Exploration Corporation Limited (OMECL), Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL), Andhra Pradesh Mineral Development Corporation (APMDC), Karnataka State Minerals Corporation Limited (KSMCL), etc.; private mining companies such as Tata Steel Limited, Hindustan Zinc Limited (HZL), JSW Steel Limited, ArcelorMittal Nippon Steel India (AM/NS), Adani Enterprises Limited, MSPL Limited, ERM Group, Deccan Gold Mines Limited, BGR Mining & Infra Ltd, Lloyds Metals and Energy Ltd, Orient Cements, etc.; and consulting organisations such as DMT Consulting Private Limited, SRK Mining Services (India) Pvt Ltd, GMMCO Technology Services Ltd, Capstone Geo Consultants, World Consultancy Services Odisha, Geovale Services, BMRC, etc. The 6th (current) version of the IMIC training was attended by 55 delegates from 18 organisations.

#### About the 6th Professional Development Program on IMIC

NACRI has formulated a 40-hour (5-day) in-person training program on IMIC, held from 5–9 May 2025. This professional development program, conducted by domain experts from NACRI and the industry, as well as online overseas guest faculty from CRIRSCO member countries, included sharing knowledge on all relevant aspects of IMIC and the Code of Ethics, mineral industry best practices in exploration, estimation, and reporting of mineral resources and reserves, and general guidance to prospective RCPs.

The course has been formulated in line with the JORC Code training program conducted by The AusIMM and is delivered under major modules such as: Why the IMIC standard? – Context and Principles; Exploration Results and Exploration Targets Reporting; How to Properly Inform Investors (Technical Studies); Reporting of Mineral Resources; Reporting of Mineral Reserves; and The Role of the Regulatory Environment.

The objectives of the IMIC training program are to:

- Appraise the obligations and liabilities of the Competent Person under the IMIC.
- Understand the role played by the IMIC in the resources sector.
- Interpret the IMIC within the context of the participants' working environment.
- · Recognize and counter common misconceptions about the IMIC.
- · Identify good and poor technical reporting.
- Understand risk and uncertainty in mineral projects.
- · Demonstrate the correct application of the IMIC.

These objectives are designed to ensure that participants gain a comprehensive understanding of both the technical and ethical responsibilities required for compliance with the IMIC, including the legal and professional liabilities associated with being a Competent Person.

A special feature of the 6th version of the IMIC training was the participation of seven overseas domain experts as guest faculty from JORC (Australasia), PERC (Europe and UK), CBRR (Brazil), SAMREC (South Africa), CIM (Canada), KCMI (Indonesia), and the USA, who spoke on best/good practices and presented practical examples on reporting of exploration results, mineral resources, and mineral reserves, wherever possible. The following esteemed overseas guest faculty made stimulating technical presentations on their respective topics:

A notable feature of the 6<sup>th</sup> version of the IMIC training was the participation of seven overseas domain experts as guest faculty, representing:

- Mr Peter Stoker JORC (Australasia): "The role of the Competent Person under the CRIRSCO Template, look at the variation in requirements for Competent/Qualified Persons of CRIRSCO NROs, Codes of Ethics and enforcement and the importance of disciplinary processes to credibility of the CRIRSCO governance system" (May 5, 2025).
- **Dr Heather King** (South Africa): "SAMREC Best practices in Mineral Exploration for CP" (May 6, 2025).
- Mr Edson Ribeiro CBRR (Brazil): "CBRR Best practices in Mineral Resources estimation & reporting" (May 7, 2025).
- Dr Abani Samal SME (USA): "Mineral Resource Reporting, Practical Examples of Mineral Resources Reporting" (May 8, 2025).



- **Dr Edmund Sides** PERC (Europe and UK): "Consideration of risk and uncertainty aspects of mineral projects, The CRIRSCO-UNFC relationship and the updated CRIRSCO-UNFC Bridging Document, Effective use of the Table- 1 Checklist" (May 8, 2025).
- **Mr Reno Pressacco** CIM (Canada): "MRMR Estimation and Reporting in the Canadian System" (May 8, 2025).
- Mr Lufi Rachmad KCMI (Indonesia): "Reporting Mineral Reserves A Team Approach" (May 9, 2025).

These experts delivered stimulating technical presentations, sharing best practices and practical examples on the estimation and reporting of exploration results, mineral resources, and mineral reserves, wherever possible. Their contributions provided participants with a global perspective on the application of reporting codes and standards, further enhancing the program's relevance and depth.

In addition to the seven overseas guest faculty members, twelve in-house faculty members from NACRI, along with domain experts from the mineral industry, made valuable contributions to the IMIC training program. The faculty for the program is primarily drawn from NACRI, with domain experts invited on specialized topics as needed.

An evaluation test was conducted at the end of each day's session to assess the participants' learning and understanding of the material presented.

#### Inaugural function held on 5th May 2025

Mr. T.R. Rajasekar, PDP Coordinator of the NACRI training program, welcomed the dignitaries and participants during the inauguration of the event. Dr. P.V. Rao, Co-Chair of NACRI, fondly recalled the invaluable mentoring and guidance received from the late Dr. Harry M. Parker, who served as Chairperson of CRIRSCO and Chairman of the SME Resources and Reserves Committee in the USA. Dr. Rao also acknowledged the support provided by Mr. Peter Stoker, Deputy Chair of JORC; Dr. Abani Samal (USA), former Co-Chair NACRI; Mr. A. Bagchi, Mr. T. Victor and all former Presidents of MEAI, each of whom played a significant role in the formation and nurturing of NACRI. Mr. Shameek Chattopadhyay, a founding member of NACRI and a domain expert in geology, also addressed the gathering.

Mr. Vinay Kumar, Director (Technical) at NMDC Limited, inaugurated the IMIC training program as the Chief Guest. In his address, he emphasised the urgent need for the mineral industry and the Indian government to adopt the IMIC framework and to train professionals for seamless implementation of the Code, ensuring transparent resource reporting that meets the expectations of potential investors. He also highlighted the importance of continuously developing professional skills to align with international standards and commended the exemplary service provided by MEAI in this regard.



#### 5. SURPAC Training (23-27 Sept 2024)





## URGENT NEED FOR SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND CAPACITY BUILDING IN CRITICAL AND STRATEGIC MINERAL EXPLORATION, BENEFICIATION AND MINING IN INDIA

#### Background and the Context

- 1. Critical and strategic minerals are essential for adoption of modern technological growth and achieving self-sufficiency or making of Aatmanirbhar Bharat. However, in addition to enhanced success in mineral exploration that is a necessity to keep the flow of auction-able mining blocks into the market and meet India's internal demands, improved emphasis on R&D leading to development of innovative technology for mineral beneficiation, metallurgical extraction of bye-products is as important for zero-waste and optimum utilisation of mineral resource. Following observations are made to flag some of the issues that constrain the projected growth of the specific mineral and mining sector and some suggestions are offered that when implemented effectively can certainly improve the outcomes for national interest.
- 2. Considering the global spread of occurrence of the minerals and metallogenic provinces, it is realized that no country is self-sufficient in its mineral resources. India has a geological and metallogenic history similar to the mineral rich shield area of Antarctica, Australia, South Africa and South America. India's geological domains are well endowed with mineral resources; however, they are yet to be fully explored, assessed and exploited. Besides, most of the exploration activities in the country so far have been of conventional type (i.e., based mostly on geological data and around old mineworkings) with restricted inputs from geochemistry, geophysics and remote sensing. Out of India's entire Obvious Geological Potential (OGP) area [0.571 million sq kml, only 12% has been explored and barely 1.5-2% is being mined. Moot question is how many of the GCM and GPM projects launched by GSI have been successfully converted to next stage of mineral exploration, say G-3 or G-2 stages? And mining in India is also largely public sector driven, controlled by Public Sector Undertakings (PSU's) accounting for around 66 per cent of the value of mineral production; the rest emanates from medium and small-scale mines that dominate the industry and are largely privately operated. Besides, mineral exploration has been carried out mostly to assess the resources up to a depth of 120 m, even though exploration and exploitation



techniques for deep seated bodies do exist up to a depth of 2,500m. Further, needless to emphasise that it requires quality geological, geophysical and geochemical data. Synergy amongst key stakeholders

- 3. Indian Bureau of Mines (IBM) has been shouldering a stupendous task of generating and analysing mineral inventory and mines production data and resorting to mineral economics data. A thorough assessment of supply and demand -comprehensive evaluation and quantification of 21st century supply and demand of minerals and rocks is needed. As per detailed analyses of mineral economics championed by IBM, the factors that influence the national resource endowment include: availability of reserves and production capacity, location & quality of ores, metal or mineral content and their production and depletion rate.
- 4. Out of 35 identified critical minerals, 17 elements, i.e., Cobalt, Graphite, Lithium, PGE, Nickel, Tin, Phosphorous, Gallium, Niobium, Magnesium, Tungsten, Hafnium, Strontium, Boron, Manganese, Antimony and Beryllium have both high supply risks as well as high economic importance for the country. Seven elements have high supply risks which are REE, Bismuth, Germanium, Indium, Tantalum, Vanadium and Rhenium. Nine elements do have high economic importance which are Copper, Silicon, Titanium, Potash, Molybdenum, Tellurium, Zirconium, Selenium and Cadmium. However, three elements namely Manganese, Magnesium and Boron are not considered as critical for the country in terms of present supply risk vulnerability as well as economic consideration, as the country has adequate resources of Manganese and Magnesium.
- 5. The areas of weakness or the hinderances in achieving the projected targets are in application of sophisticated modern techniques, wider application of modern technology of high-resolution remote sensing, detailed geophysical surveys both air-borne as well as on ground, multi-sensor aerial surveys and detailed and rapid geochemical investigations, and proper integrated and interpretation of data by computer using latest soft-wares requiring infusion of high-end technologies in the field of exploration particularly for deep seated and concealed deposits.
- 6. However, for achieving the stated objectives effectively it is imperative to focus on driving cutting-edge research with innovation & targeted exploration strategies. There is urgent need strengthen R & D efforts through synergistic collaboration of GSI and IBM and leading IITs and Universities imparting



mining and metallurgical courses and research such as IBM and BHU, etc. Creation of Centre of Excellence for Critical Minerals (CECM) in the Ministry of Mines should be tasked with detailed R&D related to mineral beneficiation, metallurgical extraction technology.

#### On Acute Shortage of Skilled Workforce

- 7. Acquired skills and knowledge are considered the major driving forces for adopting modern technological innovations for sustainable development and socio-economic growth of any country. It is estimated that only 5% of the total workforce in India has undergone formal skill training [compared to 46% in China; 68% in UK; 75% in Germany, 52% in USA, 80% in Japan and 96% in South Korea]. Only investment in technology will not help, because the machine is only as good as the skill of the user of that machine. Mineral commodity specific research is required to take advantage of the data base, resource assessment and prognostication models including for mineral beneficiation and zero-waste mining. India has immense potential to be an innovative nation and innovation in minerals and metals sector drives search for technology for separation and beneficiation of critical and strategic minerals and metals, enhances productivity and steers economic growth fostering competitive environment.
- 8. It is also recognised that the number of participants in the Indian Exploration Sector must be increased from the current 11 (compared to 400 or more for Canada and Australia each). Besides, thorough professional approach is needed in Mineral exploration utilising interdisciplinary competency, multiple skills and nurturing risk appetite attitudes. Unlike a private sector explorer, which is usually small and agile, the Government functions through multiple-layers of decision making, allocated resource crunch for upskilling and technological modernisation and large number of departments and representatives and hence, the impact of their action or otherwise, is a consequence of the weakest of those links. Multiple authorities, lack of 'ownership' and result in delays. Therefore, there is an urgent need to invest in human resource development and increase the skilled work force.
- 9. Imparting and building much needed advanced skills capacity, to discover and responsibly develop and utilise mineral resources. For development of the needed advanced skills and capacity building in modern mineral exploration techniques and mining and mineral/ element extraction methods formal MoUs and tie-ups can be worked out between Ministry of Mines, through Khanij Bidesh India Ltd.,



[KABIL] with active and synergistic involvement of GSI-MECL and IBM, and the IUGS recognised international agencies with possible financial assistance from the World Bank to establish and upgrade modern Earth Science laboratories at advanced R&D centres in India.

- 10. Skill development and capacity building can be an effective tool for enhancing productivity and safety at work place, and prepares human resources to foster adaptation of new state of art technologies in mineral exploration, mining and conservation of resources. A steady pool of skilled man-power and group of mentors including international exposures for different mineral commodities need to be nurtured through training and capacity building. Educational institutes/ Skill Development Centres need to be suitably geared to meet emerging challenges on Mechanisation, Computerization and Automation of existing and new mines.
- 11. HRD Ministry can facilitate tie-ups between top universities in India (IIT-ISM, IITs, etc.), leading research organisations and major mining companies in India and abroad, e.g., in Australia and Canada with specific course curricula on Advanced Exploration Geology, Metallurgy & Mining Geology, Skill Plan for Mining Sector (2016) also states that quality conscious and outcome-based approach in imparted modern skill-sets for sustainable mining techniques can be effective tool for enhancing productivity and safety at work place. Mining related development of skills has to be a shared responsibility of both the government as well as the mining industry. These capacity building measures including Training for Trainers [ToT] programmes, need to be strengthened on a systematic and regular basis, particularly in mineral rich territories of the states.

#### Enhanced R & D and Creation of Mineral Resources Planning Cell

12. All the known and mapped 150 mineral belts by GSI in India must be digitized as geospatial maps on priority by GSI so as to re-evaluate its worth and correlate related land-cover ground truths by stake holders. This would lead to identification of brownfield areas with potential for detailed mineral explorations. It is imperative to urgently revisit known mineralised zones for grade/ tonnage upgradation and encourage use of Core Library for R&D works, possibly in collaboration with research organisations and leading University Departments of Geosciences.



- 13. It may also be ensured that the geosciences data generated by Exploration Companies is submitted back to GSI [Mission-II] data bank and is documented for future reference and geostatistical modeling. There is need to deploy experienced geoscientists and develop the 'think tanks' for each critical mineral commodity. As a national priority, it is imperative that implementation support mechanisms are put in place such as proper quality checks, measures to coordinate between multiple sub-contractors, prioritise funding support, promote time-bound R & D and specific exploration strategies and recycling technology, etc.
- 14. It is also recommended to create and nurture dedicated center for R&D in Exploration that can be established to act as 'National Centre of Excellence in Exploration Geosciences'. Besides, there is urgent need to ensure capacity utilization of installed modern laboratory equipments. As the stress towards blind and deep-seated deposits has been building, the Centre of Excellence may work in tandem with GSI, IBM, MECL and academic institutes like and IITs, IIT-ISM, PSUs, etc.
- 15. There is a need to create a separate Expert Group on Mineral Resource Management (EGRM) that will carry out concrete and result-oriented research pertaining to sustainable Resource Management. Mineral Resources Planning Cell under PMO or NITI AAYOG to provide single window coordinated achievement of goals. The 'Central Mineral Resource Planning Cell' needs also to focus on INTERNATIONAL RESOURCE ACQUISITION based on R&D in mineral economics and prognostication on dynamic demand and supply situation in India.

Finally, it is recommended to develop stronger synergy amongst geosciences' community - be they in Universities or Research Organisations or Professional Government Departments or Geoscience Societies. A participatory approach by all concerned will truly make **Aatmanirbhar Bharat** in conformity with principles of sustainable development and care for the future generations.

Under the auspices of MEAL, a panel discussion on "Recent Supreme Court order on collection of Royalty and levying of tax on mineral bearing land by State Governments" was organised on 9-11-2024 at Hutti Gold mines, Karnataka.

The panelists included Shri. R K Sinha, Former Controller General of Mines, IBM, Dr. V D. Rajagopal, Former DGM undivided Andhra Pradesh, Shri. A. R. Vijay Singh, MEAI Council Member, Dr. C. H Rao, Chairman, MEAI Visakhapatnam Chapter. The panel discussion was moderated by Shri. D B. Sundara Raman, Vice President, Raw Material - Tata Steel and Vice President - I, MEAI. Shri. S.N. Mathur, President, MEAI also participated.

The outcome points of the panel discussion are as follows:

- If one Mineral Tax is finalised, again taxation cannot be done on Tax.
- That the interpretation of Law with regard to delegation of Powers under Article 246 of Constitution of India and in the larger interest of the industry it is not desirable that the State Governments shall levy taxes on minerals independently. It is better such powers are vested with Union Govt, with regard to Major Minerals. To achieve this objective the constitutional amendments are required to Article 246 delegating exclusive powers on levy of taxes on minerals to the Union Govt.
- Classification of mineralised lands is to be done by the Govt. of India.
- . Different states are levying different rates of Taxes. As the supreme court itself has said that the Union Government can go to parliament to enact the upper limits for the Major minerals levied by states in the MMDR act. Now it the time that both Major and Minor minerals need the upper cap amendments in the Act.
- . Upholding the principles of federalism, the verdict clarified that the power of State Legislature to tax minerals activities within their respective territories is not constrained by Parliament's MMDR act, 1957.
- State can collect tax on mineral rights SUBJECT to "ANY LIMITAION" by Parliamentary law on Mineral development to ensure taxing power of State does not adversely affect the development of Minerals.

Subject: Objection and Comments on the Proposal to Amend the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 - Reclassification of Limestone/Dolomite/Laterite from Minor to Major

Respected Sir.

We respectfully submit this representation in response to the Public Consultation Notice dated 31.12.2024 issued by the Ministry of Mines, concerning the proposed amendments to the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act. 1957 (MMDR Act). Our comments specifically pertain to paragraph 1.4.4(i) of the Annexure, which proposes the removal of Limestone, Laterite, and Dolomite from the list of minor minerals via notification by the Central Government.

We submit our strong objection to the proposed reclassification of Limestone as a major mineral. Limestone—particularly when used in the manufacture of white cement and allied products/firme industries has consistently been classified as a minor mineral and regulated through State-specific rules framed under Section 15 of the MMDR Act. A unilateral reclassification at this stage would undermine the legal and operational certainty of leasehold rights that have been lawfully granted and are currently being exercised under the existing regulatory framework.

We submit for your consideration that, pursuant to the amendment under Rule 9 of the Rajasthan Minor Mineral Concession Rules, 2017 (RMMCR-2017), existing mining leases for such minerals are eligible for extension up to 31st March 2040. This extension is subject to the advance payment of a premium amount, calculated at the applicable annual dead rent rate for each year of the extended period. These provisions have been duly framed by the State Government in exercise of its delegated authority under Section 15(1) of the MMDR Act, 1957, and remain valid and enforceable unless expressly superseded by a competent legal

In Rajasthan, several existing Limestone/dolomite mining leaseholders have exercised this option and have duly applied for lease period extensions under Rule 9 of RMMCR-2017. The first instalment of the premium amount in crores of Rupees has already been deposited with state government till March 2025 by these lessees in accordance with the prescribed rules.

This action has been undertaken in good faith and in compliance with the applicable provisions of the RMMCR-2017. The leaseholders have relied upon the prevailing statutory mechanism, thereby creating a vested and legitimate legal interest under the principle of legal certainty. In this regard, we respectfully highlight that certain lease holders / applicants, had already submitted the application for extension of the mining lease within the stipulated time and have also duly deposited the first instalment of the premium rent, in full compliance with the applicable rules.

Furthermore, following issues also needs to take care before taking any policy decision in the referencea) Letter of Intent (LoI) Issued by State of Rajasthan for Minor Mineral Leases

- The State of Rajasthan has been issuing LoIs under RMMCR-2017 for minor minerals.
- Rule 9(3A) allows lease extension only up to March 31, 2040, for lessees who have completed 50 years of tenure. It is not considered a renewal.

- Once limestone (for lime making) is classified as other than minor mineral i.e. major mineral, such Lols or extensions may lose validity, as lease grant/extension processes will shift under the central regime. Any Lots issued for areas now falling or being considered under "major minerals" classification would
- likely be invalid, unless a transitory provision is framed by the MoM (similar to Section 10A(2)(c)). In certain cases, after obtaining Lois, the other requisite approvals, clearances or permissions etc. also would have been obtained and are awaiting execution of lease deeds, and in the absence of transitory provisions all the efforts, monetary payments, etc. shall be in vain.

#### b) Renewals or Extensions after Reclassification

- No concept of renewals or extensions exist for mining leases of major minerals under the MMDR regime post lease expiry for private lease holders (non PSUs).
- Once the mineral is classified as major mineral leases expire after 50 years (from the date of original grant) without any provision for further extension/s or renewal/s and the concept of "renewal" is replaced with "auction-based grant" i.e. the held areas need to be surrendered soon after completion of 50 years and further granted only by way of auction and in addendum, most of the cases are not meant for captive purposes and hence the option or benefit of "Right of First Refusal" is also not adalieve.
- Thus, any ongoing renewal applications or extensions under state rules stand nullified post reclassification.

#### c) Rights of Patta / Khatedari Land Holders

- The land rights do not automatically confer mining rights. After reclassification:
  - Khatedari/patta holders will have to reapply under central regime.
  - Any private land being mined under lease will need conversion under central regulations, subject to new land acquisition or compensation frameworks.
  - Even if the land is private, mineral rights rest with the government private ownership doesn't guarantee a lease for major minerals.
- Existing agreements may no longer be valid for mining purposes unless the lease is reconfirmed under MMDR regime.

#### d) Royalty and Dead Rent Impacts

- After reclassification:
  - 'e Royalty will be as per Section 9 Second Schedule of MMDR Act.

  - IBM's ASP becomes the base for royalty, often much higher than minor mineral rates.

    E.g., Limestone (lime making) under minor mineral has Rs. 90–135/PMT, while under major mineral, 0 it may exceed Rs. 160-200/PMT or more, depending on ASP.
  - Dead rent will also be as per central scale, which is generally higher and area-based.
- Substantial increase in royalty outgo. Higher dead rent as per Schedule I of MMDR Act.
- Uniformity across India but loss of fiscal advantage previously enjoyed under state minor mineral regime

#### e) Pending Approvals under RMMCR-2017

- No saving clause currently exists like Section 10A(2)(c) (MMDR Act-2015).
- Leases under process but not granted will likely be considered void post the 50-year mark.
- Central Government must urgently notify a saving clause to safeguard such applicants and avoid legal
- This will affect entities with Lots or ECs in pipeline for minor mineral limestone / dolomite / laterite.

#### f) Area Limits under Section 6 of MMDR Act

- State's discretion on area limits ends.
- Section 6 of MMDR Act restricts lease area for major minerals to 50 sq. km per state per entity.
- Existing leases of up to 10 sq. km are safe, but multiple leases in Rajasthan held by the same entity may exceed this limit.
- This creates legal and operational anomalies unless:
  - A relaxation is granted by the Centre (under Section 6(1)(c)), or
  - Lessees restructure holdings.
  - Lessees with >50 sq. km (some more than 10 sq. km. per lease) may face:
    - Surrender of excess area
    - Re-auction of surplus land
    - Legal complexities due to area violations

This creates regulatory anomaly, unless exemptions or relaxation is granted.

#### g) Mining Plan Approvals - DMG vs IBM

- Once reclassified, all mining plans/schemes must be approved by IBM under MCDR, 2017.
- Existing mining plans approved by DMG (State) will become inoperative.
- Lessees must
  - Appoint qualified personnel (Mining Engineer/Geologist).

  - Submit revised plans to IBM.
     Comply with MCDR timelines.

#### h) Drone Survey, Star Rating, IBM Registration

- While drone surveys and DEMs are already mandatory under RMMCR since 24.10.2024, the IBM obligations post-reclassification are:
  - Mandatory registration under Rule 45 of MCDR, 2017. 0
  - Filing of monthly and annual returns. 0
  - Appointment of mining engineers and geologists. 0
  - Star Rating compliance, inspections, penalties, etc. 0
- These obligations are cost-intensive, especially for small leaseholders and traditional players under minor regime.
- Relaxation or phased compliance may be sought for existing minor leases.

#### Dolomite and Laterite Reclassification

- Dolomite and Laterite, if reclassified, will face same consequences:
  - Lease approvels, mining plans, and returns via IBM.
     Royalty rates to be fixed by Central Govt. (ASP-based).

  - Area limit issues under Section 6.
  - Mandatory technical staffing.
  - Existing leases may require revalidation or face cancellation.

In light of this, we humbly request the Ministry to kindly condone the delay in the submission of this representation and treat it as a valid, bona fide, and timely objection arising from subsequent and unforeseen official communication.

The proposed reclassification, if implemented, would result in serious prejudice to the rights and legitimate expectations of existing leaseholders, many of whom have made significant financial and infrastructural investments based on the current framework.

We submit that such a reclassification:

- Undermines the authority granted to State Governments under Section 15 of the MMDR Act and could render state-framed rules like the RMMCR-2017 ineffective, creating administrative and legal
- 2. Imposes uncertainty over the tenure, applicability, and validity of lease extensions lawfully granted by the State under the existing regime;
- Disrupts existing business operations and investments, with potential legal implications and financial losses for leaseholders who have acted in accordance with the law.

We therefore urge the Ministry of Mines to:

- Reconsider and withdraw the proposal to reclassify Limestone/dolomite/laterite as a major mineral; Maintain the current classification of Limestone/dolomite/laterite as a minor mineral for specific end-uses
- Protect the rights of leaseholders who have acted in accordance with State-specific rules and made substantial investments in reliance on the law.

We trust that the Ministry will carefully consider these objections and take appropriate action to ensure that the rights of all stakeholders, especially those who have made legal and financial commitments based on existing laws, are respected.
